UCAS Deadlines

1. **UCAS Extra opens** – 25th February 2025

For students who have not gained an offer from any of their five chosen universities. This allows the students to add an extra choice one at a time until an offer has been made.

2. **UCAS university decisions due** – 14th May 2025

Deadline for universities to respond to your application.

3. **UCAS confirm choices deadline** – 5th June 2025

The deadline to confirm your first and insurance university from the offers that have been made. A later deadline may apply if you are still awaiting a decision from a university.

4. **UCAS Extra deadline** – 4th July 2025

5. **UCAS Clearing opens** – 5th July 2025

Clearing opens - students can begin researching available universities and courses prior to knowing if an offer has been confirmed.

- Deadline May 2025 – to ensure funding is in place for the start of the academic year

Halls of residence

- Halls of residence are owned by your university and they're mostly reserved for first year students. They're usually closer to campus and can be cheaper than other types of accommodation.
- You'll need to apply for a place in halls of residence through the university accommodation office, and you can usually do this online. You'll apply for a few different halls and rate them in your preference order, but bear in mind they are popular, so you may not get your first choice. Check the university website for details on how and when to apply.

University Bursary

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You can apply for a bursary if:

- you, your parents or guardians receive two means-tested benefits, two elements of Universal Credit or you are in the care of the local authority
- you are between 17 and 24 years old
- you have been living in Wiltshire or Swindon for at least two years*
- you are eligible for funding through Student Finance England
- you are planning to study (or already studying) for your first undergraduate degree at a UK university/institution.
