Level 3 Business (Cambridge Technical) can be studied as an Extended Certificate (worth one A level). This builds upon the Business knowledge students developed at KS4. Equally, students who have not taken Business as a GCSE can also work toward this qualification.

The course has been developed to meet the changing needs of the Business sector and prepare students for Higher Education, Apprenticeships or employment.

The course supports the transferable skills required by universities and employers such as communication, problem solving, time management, research and analytical skills.



On this qualification you will undertake a mixture of coursework units and examined units within the pathway chosen.

All Students Study

Exam Units: The Business Environment and Working in Business (2 exams) and an optional exam unit.

Coursework Units: Customers and Communication, Marketing and Market Research and an optional coursework unit.

Five units in total must be completed.

Skills Gained
