A level Fine Art is a practical and creative course in which students will explore traditional and contemporary ideas about art. Students will work with a variety of materials and techniques painting and drawing, 3D work and ceramics, photography, printmaking, mixed media, and contextual studies

Fine Art is a practical and an academic A level which provides a creative outlet and a high level of challenge. As well as developing and enhancing your fine art skills your coursework portfolio will enable you to develop an idea from concepts and studies to finished final pieces.

Students who choose this course will benefit from a stimulating practical form of expression which provides distinctive skills and experience for life, work and further studies.

Course Content (AQA)

Component 1: Personal Investigation. This is a practical unit with written elements in which you are expected to develop a personal investigation based on an idea, issue, concept or theme leading to a finished piece or pieces. The personal investigation is supported by a written element of 1000-3000 words, set and marked by the centre and moderated by AQA.

Component 2: This is an externally set assignment. It is produced in timed conditions over 15 hours. Work produced will be marked by the centre and moderated by AQA.
